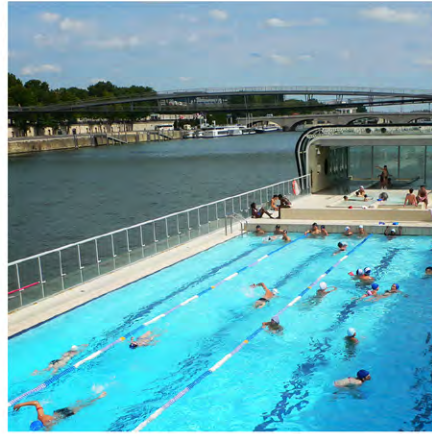

Runner's High Parc des Buttes-Chaumont

River Swim Piscine Joséphine-Baker
